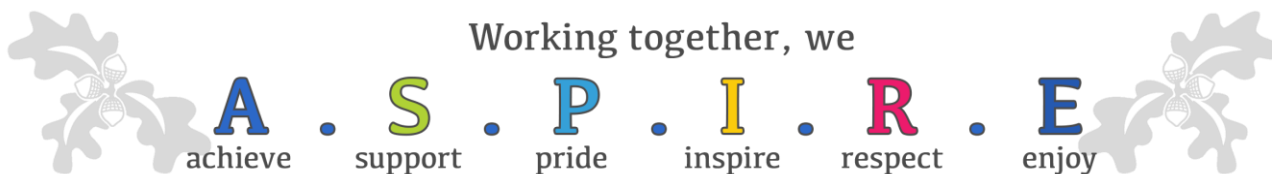
We believe that the wearing of a school uniform enables children to identify with our school, gives a sense of belonging, is practical and smart, reinforces a positive work ethos and reduces expenditure for parents/carers. Uniform is compulsory and we expect all parents/carers to support the school's strict uniform rules.

Aims:

- All children wear the correct uniform to school.
- Children feel proud to belong to the school.
- Parents/carers share the expectations of the school.

Expectations:

- It is expected that children wear their school uniform or on P.E. days, their P.E. kit with the appropriate footwear
- If a child does not wear the correct uniform or P.E. kit, a verbal or written reminder of our expectations will be communicated to the parents/carer
- Children wear P.E. kits to school on the days that they have P.E. lessons- this will be communicated at the start of the year by your child's class teacher
- Parents must **clearly label every item** of school clothing with their child's name
- The children are responsible for taking care of their own items of uniform
- If your child returns home from school without an item of uniform, please check lost property and speak with class teacher
- Children are not allowed to wear jewellery to school. The exceptions are plain studded pierced earrings and religious items. We ask the children to remove these during PE lessons. This is to prevent them from causing injury. We recommend that, should you wish to have your child's ear(s) pierced, this is done at the beginning of the summer holiday to allow sufficient time for it to heal, therefore enabling your child to safely remove them for PE lessons once school begins
- Long hair should be tied back at all times
- Nail vanish or gel nails are not permitted in school
- P.E. jumpers **must not have hoods** as this is a health and safety issue during P.E. lessons
- **Short-legged black shorts are permitted under dresses or skirts – these must not be longer than the dress or skirt and must only be black in colour.**
- **Summer Uniform options can be worn from the start of April until the last day of September.**





- If the temperature reaches 28° or above, children will have permission to remove their ties by staff or the Headteacher will announce on Class Dojo School Story.

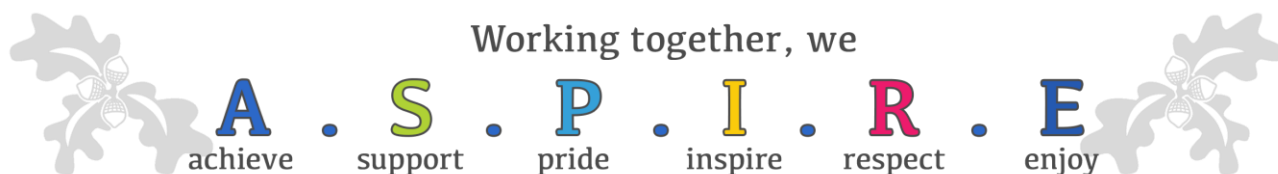
Monitoring, evaluation and review

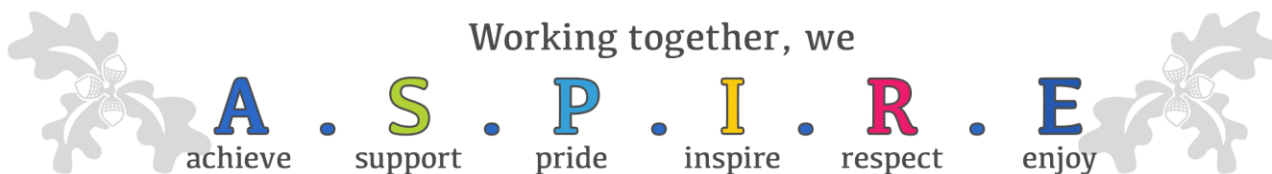

¹ Skirts must be no more than 5cm above the knee and no more than 5cm below the knee. Grey tights may be worn in winter (no socks over tights)

² Blue/White checked dress or playsuit (Summer) to be worn with white socks NOT tights. Skirts must NOT be worn over trousers or leggings

³ Boots, trainers and sandals are not permitted





⁴ Children are permitted to wear 1 pair of plain studded earrings to school. For health and safety reasons we do not allow the children to wear them for PE/Games. Please ensure that your child does not wear them to school on these days

⁵ Boots, trainers and sandals are not permitted

⁶ Long hair is hair that can obstruct a child's vision (ie. can cover their eyes).

Adverse Weather

During adverse weather conditions, children can wear boots to school, but must change into their school shoes upon arrival. If worn, roll necked tops, vests and thermal layers should not be visible. When there are high temperatures in the summer months, the school will inform parents if children are allowed to attend school without their ties.

Hair

Pupils with long hair (hair that can reach their eyes), regardless of gender, should have it tied back whilst in school, with either a blue or black hair band. Blue gingham check alicebands or scrunchies may be worn with a summer dress. Beads must not be worn in the hair. Haircuts should not exceed a number two cut. This obviously means that shaved heads are not permitted. No logos, lines or patterns should be cut into the hair. Any type of bleaching or colouring of the hair is not permitted.

Health and Safety

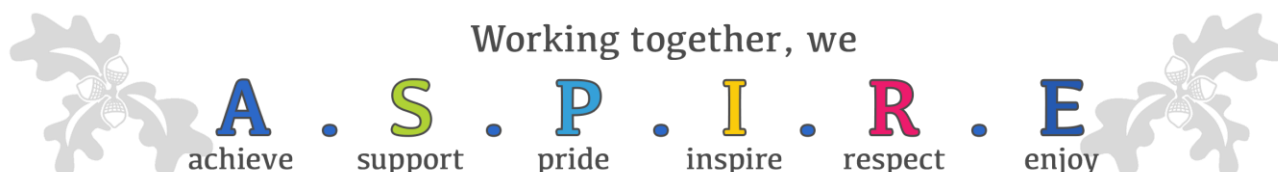
As a general rule, no jewellery should be worn to school. The only exception is that children with pierced ears may wear small, plain studs. However, these cannot be worn during P.E., games or swimming. If a child is not able to remove his/her own studs parents must ensure that they are not worn on P.E. days. Rings can be dangerous and must not be worn. Bracelets ([including charity bands](#)) and necklaces are also not permitted.

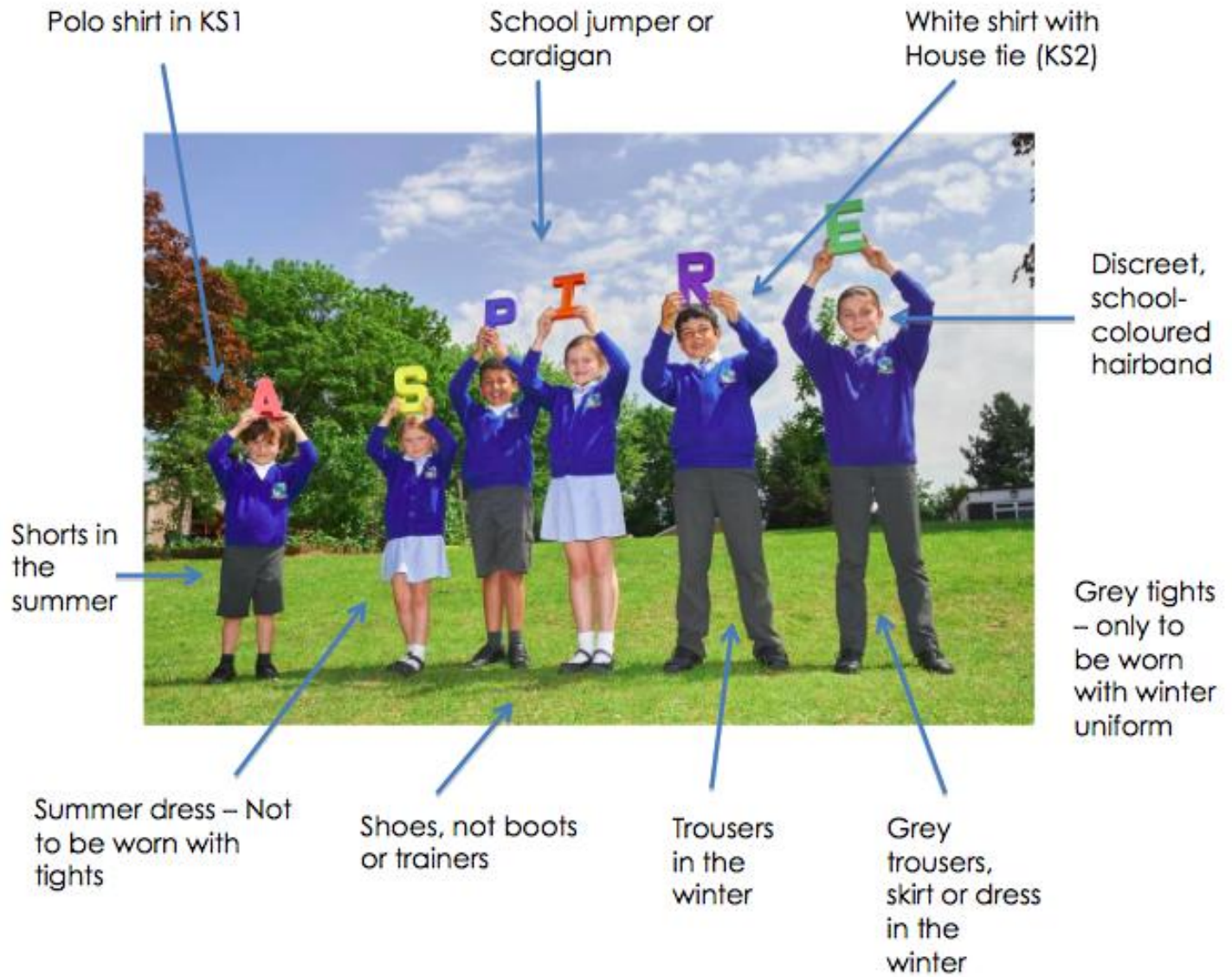
In keeping with Borough Policy, children often work barefoot during PE lessons. During the colder weather, children may wear tracksuits or additional jumpers for outdoor PE if the teacher thinks it necessary. Jogging suits / sweatshirt tops with the school logo can be purchased from the Kevin's in Pinner.

It is important that all clothing is clearly named. The school office keeps a lost property box and the children can go to them to look for lost items.

Specific uniform for Warrender (jumpers, ties, PE t-shirts, book bags etc) can all be purchased from Kevin's Schoolwear, 104 Marsh Road, Pinner, HA5 5NA. www.myclothing.com also supply some items including, Warrender cardigans, jumpers and a limited colours of PE t shirts. Our PTA also run termly preloved uniform sales too!

Parents' co-operation in these matters is greatly appreciated, as we consider it part of a child's education to take pride in their appearance and have a sense of responsibility. We do have high standards at Warrender and this is due largely to the excellent support we get from our parents.





If you do like to walk, cycle or scoot to school and worry about keeping your feet dry, please feel free to wear boots on your journey to and from school – just make sure you have your school shoes to change into once you arrive.
