


Warrender Top-Reads




Unfortunately, I am unable to give you a summary of this because, of course, I didn't look in it...however I have heard that some children find it gets the better of them and they simply can't put it down!


Poor Duncan just wants to colour in. But when he opens his box of crayons, he only finds letters, all saying the same thing: We quit.

A funny, touching and triumphant picture book story about a giraffe who finds his own tune and confidence too, with joyful illustrations from Guy Parker Rees.






























Hold on to your broomstick for magical mayhem!




