# Taming

- 1. Don't rush!
- Sit and wait near the dragon and let it come to you
- 3. Dragon chooses game
- Listen to growls because they mean stop
- Wait with your hand out and let it come to you

### Taming your Dragon

Before you begin, you must know the key to taming a dragon is not to rush!

First, find a comfortable spot near the dragon.

Next, sit patiently and wait for the dragon to come to you.

When the creature is close, it will let you know which game it wants to play. Let the dragon choose!

Once the game is underway, listen carefully to the beast's growls. If they get louder, it means you have to stop!

Finally, once the game is over, slowly extend your hand and let the dragon come to you. If it touches your hand with its face, you have been successful!

## Training

- Create a purpose-built saddle
- Get on the dragon's back and hold on tightly
- If you fall off, you may need to make adjustments to your saddle
- Practise until you are both more confident

### Training your Dragon

Flying a dragon is a fun skill, but it takes time to master.

Firstly, it is important that you carefully create a purpose-built saddle to fit your dragon's back.

Once this is ready, attach it securely to the dragon.

After this, mount the dragon vigilantly and hold on tightly. The dragon will take off immediately.

If you fall off, you may need to make alterations to your saddle because a dragon's flight is very bumpy!

Following this, practise for many hours (or days), until you both feel more confident. You can do this safely by tying yourself up on to something stable.

Finally, enjoy your safe flight!

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### **Bedtime routines**

- Dragons sleep upside down like bats
- Fresh grass to relax your dragon
- Scratch underside of neck to send to sleep
- Be quiet dragons have great hearing

### Bedtime routines

Did you know dragons sleep upside down like bats? These instructions will help you get your pet relaxed for bedtime.

During the day, ensure that your dragon gets plenty of exercise to tire it out.

When it is bedtime, carefully place some grass (freshly cut) by your dragon's bed to help it relax.

Next, give your pet dragon a vigorous scratch. If you scratch the underside of its neck, it will fall asleep instantly.

Finally, be quiet! Dragons have excellent hearing.

### How to feed your dragon

- Dragons eat a lot of fish: cod, salmon (not eels!)
- Dragons can get very cross at the sight of eels!
- Let the dragon sniff the fish and take its time.
- Clear away any mess after!

### Feeding your Dragon

Before you consider having a pet dragon, you must be aware that they eat a vast amount of fish. They particularly enjoy salmon, cod, trout and mackerel.

First, buy or catch a large number of fish in order to have enough for your pet to eat three times a day.

Be careful not to include eels in the mix, or your dragon will be very cross!

When you have the fish, pour it generously out onto the ground in front of the dragon.

After that, step back quickly and let the beast have a good sniff to decide whether it is happy with the choice of fish.

Once the fish has been eaten, clear away any mess.

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
