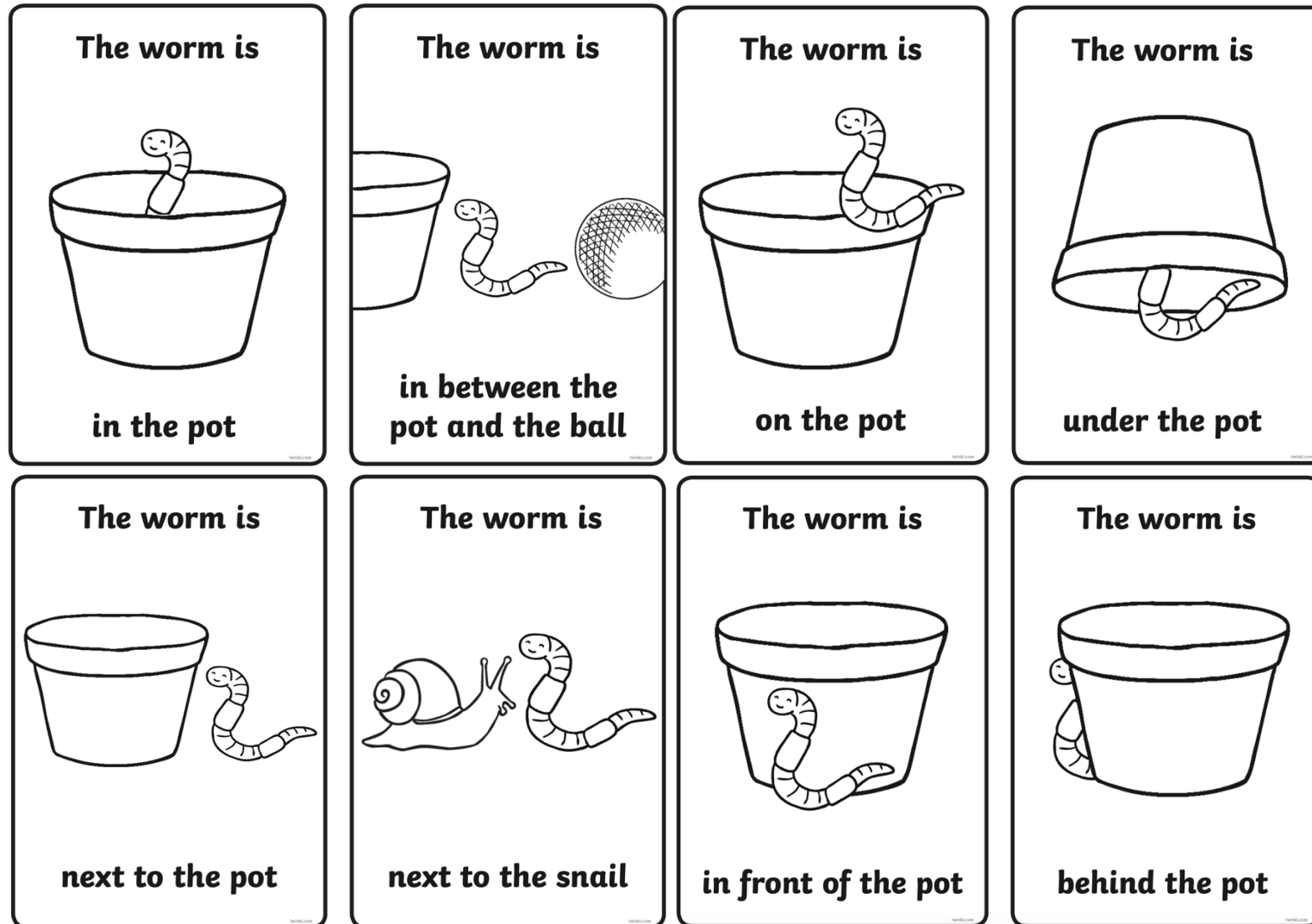


We are learning about positional language (prepositions)
